Introducing the Lessons

1st Reading: Isaiah 65:1-9

In our Hebrew scripture lesson the prophet receives an answer to his prayer that God reveal the divine presence once more, forgiving sin, renewing the land, and restoring the temple. It was not God who has been absent, but the people who would not receive the Lord, preferring divinization and the worship of false gods, the prophet is told. Yet, as bad clusters of grapes are separated from the good in the making of wine, so the merciful Lord will separate the faithful from the unfaithful and renew blessing for all God's true servants.

2nd Reading: Galatians 3:23-29

In this New Testament lesson we hear that the era of domination by the law is passed. Through faith all find themselves baptized into a unity in Christ. Formerly we were like small children who had to be closely watched. Now, through God's justification, we are given the status of young adults coming into their maturity. Whatever the former barriers of race, class, or gender, we are together heirs of the promise to Abraham.

The Gospel: Luke 8:26-39

In our gospel reading Jesus sends many demons out of a man who calls himself Legion and who is then restored to his right mind. The crazed man lived a wild life out among the tombs. When Jesus commands the demonic to come out of Legion, "they" recognize him as "Son of the Most High God." The demons will end up in a herd of pigs and then be destroyed by drowning, but the man will be enabled to return home and to tell of Jesus.

Care Notes Corner

Summertime is fast approaching; however, the warm days are already upon us. Pools have opened and some people enjoy spending spare time by the pool or even at the beach. Many individuals have boats and enjoy time out on the water. These activities are enjoyable; however, water safety is an essential part of our fun. According to the Centers for Disease Control (2022), drowning in the age groups 1 through 14 years is the second leading cause of "unintentional deaths by injury" in the United States. Prevention is a key factor. There are several things that you can do to keep yourself, family, and friends safe. If you have a pool in your yard, make sure that there is a fence around it and remove any toys after each use, so that children will not be tempted to gain access to them when you are not around. Swim lessons are important. Learn to swim and teach children to swim before entering the water. Always supervise children when they are in or around the water. Have a buddy system. Take heed to lifeguard warnings when on the beach in consideration of riptides and high wind warnings. Wear a life jacket that is coast guard approved when out on a boat and pay attention to weather warnings. Learn CPR. CPR can improve the outcome of a drowning victim immensely.
