Welcome—we are glad you are here! Know that whoever you are, and where ever you are in your spiritual journey, you have a place here. If you are new, or haven't yet given us your contact information, please complete the attached communication card and place it in the plate so that you can learn more about Epiphany's community.

Introducing the Lessons

1st Reading: Acts 9:1-20

In this reading from the story of the early church we hear how Paul is converted from being an enemy of the Christian way in order to become the great apostle to the non-Jewish peoples. While he is headed toward Damascus to persecute Christians, Paul is encountered by the risen Jesus. Jesus calls him by his Jewish name, Saul, and asks why he is persecuting him by persecuting his followers. Paul is blinded by the experience, and is instructed to proceed to Damascus, where God will offer further guidance.

2nd Reading: Revelation 5:11-14

This lesson presents a heavenly vision of the Lamb that was slainfigure of Jesus. Myriads of angels surround the elders and living creatures as they sing praises to the Lamb, joined by every creature in heaven, on earth, and under the earth. He who through his blood has offered ransom for his people now lives and is worthy of all honor and alorv.

The Gospel: John 21:1-19

Our gospel tells of another appearance by Jesus to his disciples—this time after their return to the Sea of Tiberias or Galilee. Several of the disciples go fishing and do not immediately recognize Jesus standing on the shore and telling them where fish may be caught. Then the disciple whom Jesus loved (perhaps intended as a model for all disciples) perceives it is the Lord. Led by the impulsive Peter they all join Jesus, bringing with them their net full with a hundred fifty-three large fish. (The significance of this number remains unknown to us.) As often in these stories, they share a meal with their risen Lord. Jesús asks Simon Peter three times if he loves him, and three times instructs Peter to tend and feed his sheep as an expression of that love. Peter will glorify God even in his death.
