In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

If you desire to be Baptized and thereby enter into membership in the mystical Body of Christ, please contact the Priest-in-Charge.

We do not allow the practice of intinction, or dipping the bread into the consecrated wine. If you do not wish to receive, please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest.

At the altar rail, to receive the bread, lay your right hand in your left hand, palm open. To receive the wine, as the priest brings the chalice to your lips, gently touch the base to help guide it to your lips.

If you would like communion brought to you in your pew, please tell an usher and the priest will come to you.

The priest and ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

Introducing the Lessons

1st Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

In our lesson from the Hebrew Bible the prophet Isaiah sets forth a majestic vision of a time when people throughout the world will worship the Lord and live in peace with one another. The mountain of the city of Jerusalem will be raised up to become a symbol of hope and justice to every nation. Many peoples will look to Jerusalem and to its holy Mount Zion as the place from which God will issue God's word and law, bringing about an end to strife and warfare.

2nd Reading: Romans 13:11-14

In this reading Paul urges a way of life in full awareness of the nearness of salvation. Disciples must recognize that the nightime of sinfulness is passing. The daylight, the time for now conduct and the following of Jesus, now comes.

The Gospel: Matthew 24:36-44

In our gospel lesson Jesus tells his disciples of the need for readiness because the Son of Man will come at a day and hour which no one knows. People will continue to go about the their usual affairs, when suddenly this time of judgment will happen. Disciples are to be ever watchful, imagining themselves like a householder whose alertness could prevent a robbery.
