Easter marks a new day in the liturgical year. We are reborn as Jesus is resurrected, washed clean of our misdeeds by his death on the Cross. It is no surprise that Easter is a springtime holy feast – all of nature is reborn, from glowers and bushes to worms and baby eaglets.

It is also a time of rebirth and re-energizing in our Episcopal Diocese of Virginia: we are about to elect a new Bishop Suffragan after the retirement of Bp. David Jones, and we have just learned of a new initiative to respond to the wind-down of the litigation for properties taken from the diocese by departing congregations.

This initiative, called DaySpring, brings together folks with a range of talents to figure out next steps with the properties that were returned and the resources that have flowed back to the diocese. Some of these steps have to do with getting continuing congregations (those members of the parishes who did not want to leave the Episcopal Church) back and functioning in their original church homes. Some have to do with creative repurposing of the spaces, particularly when there is no continuing congregation. Some have to do with sharing the benefits of these changes with other parishes, particularly those in need of some revitalization, and with creating new ways for this diocese to grow and thrive.

DaySpring is described in greater detail in this quarter's *Virginia Episcopalian*, which should have arrived in your mailbox by now. If you did not receive one, please let us in the office know so we can update the diocesan records. I urge you to celebrate the new beginnings of springtime, of Eastertide, and of the diocese with joy and anticipation!

## Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on March 13<sup>th</sup>, opening with a Bible study and a review of the highs and lows of the previous month. Some highlights of the meeting:

- Garrett Russell made a presentation on his Eagle Scout project – building our new playground. The Vestry approved his plan and is assisting him with fundraising to cover the costs.
- The finances of the parish continue to be good, with a small deficit at the end of February due to some large periodic outlays.
- We continue in the process to refinance the mortgage. The names of the new trustees were filed with the County and once they are approved, we will get an order of encumbrance to proceed. This should save the parish several thousand dollars in interest per year.
- We have submitted the results of the mini-audit to the diocese and now need to set up an internal audit committee for the 2011 review.
- We voted to approve transitioning our database software from a PC-resident program to a cloud-based program. This secure solution saves us from having to back up the database every week and is only slightly more costly than the current support contract.
- Mary will be away April 19-22. On Sunday April 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Rev., Roger Robillard, a retired priest of the diocese, will be our supply priest.

The meeting ended with prayer at 8:30 pm.

### THE ULTIMATE IN RECYCLING

#### What is organ, eye and tissue donation?

The process of recovering organs, eyes and tissues from a deceased person and transplanting them into others in order to save lives or improve the health of those in need.

#### What difference can one donor make?

One organ donor can save the lives of 9 transplant recipients. One tissue donor can enhance the lives of more than 50 people. One cornea donor can bring sight to two people.

#### What organs and tissues may be donated from one donor?

The transplantable organs are the heart, 2 lungs, 2 kidneys, split liver, pancreas and intestines. The heart, lungs, kidneys and liver are the most commonly transplantable organs. A pancreas transplant is successful in curing diabetes. Intestinal transplants save the lives of patients whose intestines have been severely damaged through illness, trauma or birth defects. Commonly recovered and transplantable tissues enhance the lives of many who suffer from traumatic injury or disease.

Skin is used as a temporary dressing for burns, serious abrasions and other exposed areas.

Bone is used in orthopedic surgery to facilitate healing of fractures or to prevent amputation.

Heart valves are used to replace defective valves, often in children.

Tendons are used to repair torn ligaments on knees or other joints.

Veins are used in cardiac bypass surgery.

Corneas can restore sight to the blind.

Please consider being an organ, eye or tissue donor by contacting your nearest Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) office. They are the main point of contact with the Donor Registry for most Virginia citizens. All specific limitations must be completed by going to the Donor Registry at [DonateLifeVirginia.org](http://DonateLifeVirginia.org), where you click on "Update My Info," enter your log-in information and make the changes you wish.

## ***CARITAS returns to Epiphany...***

1. We will collect personal care items to give each guest at CARITAS a 'welcome bag'. Please bring in the following items and leave them at the church. A box will be in the narthex.

Items include: travel size toiletries such as shampoo, soap, body wash, deodorant, toothbrush and toothpaste, travel first-aid kit, playing cards.

2. CARITAS will be May 12-15 and there will be many opportunities to help. The sign-up sheet will be in the hallway across from the nursery. Here is a description of the opportunities.

**DRIVERS:** Each night between 7—9 PM we will need people to drive our guests to do laundry and take showers. We go to the local YMCA and the closest Laundromat.

**SLEEPOVER:** Each night we need one volunteer to spend the night at the church. Come by that evening, chat with our guests, and enjoy a restful night's sleep in the parlor. Then get up and put out the 'grab and go' breakfast. Pick up a bit and you are gone by 7 AM.

**PROVIDE BREAKFAST ITEMS:** Each morning we provide a 'grab and go' breakfast for the guests. We need volunteers to bring in these items the night before. We will provide the suggested list of items, but they include juice, muffins, granola bars, protein bars, hard boiled eggs.

**DINNER CREW:** Each night we will provide dinner for our group. If you would like to be part of this, just sign up and you will be given a dish to make and then asked to come by at 6 PM to serve the meal, clean up the kitchen and then to assemble the lunches for the next day (those items will already be on hand).

**SET-UP CREW:** On Saturday, May 12, we need 3 people to help unload and set up the beds for our guests. This takes less than 2 hours and we usually start around 9 AM.

## *What's Happening in the Diocese?*

Candidates for Suffragan were announced on February 3<sup>rd</sup>, then there were “walkabouts,” or meetings where you could meet the candidates, throughout the diocese in March. The election of the new Suffragan will be on April 21<sup>st</sup> and ordination will be at St Paul’s Richmond, with Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori leading the service, on July 28<sup>th</sup>.

### *Epiphany's ECW Card Ministry*
