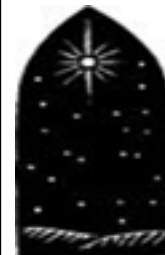

Introducing the Lessons

1st Reading: Genesis 11:1-9

In this Hebrew scripture lesson, God frustrates an attempt to build a city and a tower to extend human influence beyond the limits appropriate for mortals and intercedes to scatter the people and confuse their speech. In an imagined time when human beings shared a common language, they gather on a Mesopotamian plain and erect a city and a ziggurat, the summit of which was believed to provide access to heaven. This story may originally have arisen to explain the diversity of tongues and cultures, recalling too, the glory of Hammurabi's empire centered in Babylon.

2nd Reading: Acts 2:1-21

This lesson tells the story of the Holy Spirit filling the apostles and empowering them to share the message of the gospel with people of different languages. Clearly this was a most dramatic moment in the life of the early church, an experience described in terms of wind and fire. From the time forward the mighty works of God done in Jesus will be told to all the people of the earth, crossing barriers of language and culture.

The Gospel: John 14:8-17, 25-27

In our gospel Jesus tells his disciples that in him the Father has been revealed, and he promises the gift of another Counselor, the Spirit of truth, to be with them. The Lord is speaking with his followers on the night before his death. Soon he will be taken away from them, but all that they ask the father will now grant in Jesus' name. As they continue to love Jesus and keep his commands, the Advocate, the indwelling Spirit, will lead them into further truth and give them a profound peace beyond what the world can offer.
