

Dear Friends,

This labor Day Weekend marks the end of summer and a return to the duties and tasks of the year ahead. For many this is a time of transition as our sons and daughters or our grandchildren head off to new adventures for the first time. Just the other day our son Fred sent me a text with a picture of our five and a half year old grandson going off to kindergarten and his brother who is almost two heading off to pre-school. They live in Potomac, Maryland. Another grandson enters high school this year in Colonial Heights. As I thought about these grandchildren embarking on new adventures I was reminded that not so very long ago I watched with Jeannie as our oldest son, now 43, stepped onto the school bus in Westborough, Massachusetts on his way to his first day of school. I remember as the doors of the school closed and David disappeared out of sight, I felt a lump in my throat, a feeling many parents experience at times like these. Then, at the other end of the spectrum, there are the steps we take as we retire from work that has been so much a part of our lives. Our lives meet new challenges. As I look back over the summer, I wonder where the time went, yet as I look over the past four decades, I wonder also where the time has gone!

Life is a series of transitions in our personal lives, in our families, and in our church family as well. Life is a continuous movement from what has become familiar, often comfortable to the next chapter where we find ourselves facing the unknown. For us here at Epiphany it is my sense as I continue to live and work among you, that you are making good use of this interim period during which you are looking forward to calling a new rector. As perhaps was the case early on, there was a sense of urgency to move through the search process as quickly as possible, which is a natural thing to experience. As time progressed, however, I have sensed that a patience with the time of transition has developed and that you are making good use of this time to move forward. While there is naturally the desire to hold on to traditions that have

been marks of this parish over the years, there is also a willingness in many ways to look at the way we have been doing things over the years with fresh eyes. I remember some years ago someone saying with conviction that the Seven Last Words of Christ were “We’ve always done it this way before.” While there will always be times when some changes will face resistance, it is my sense that you as a congregation are open to exploring new avenues in your life together as you prepare to welcome your new rector. And of course the beauty of an interim period is that when a change of some kind is made and people don’t like it, the interim will be gone! This can be for us all a time of adventure when we can all learn new things and we can all grow. For me, for example, our work with Ellen Johnston from the Center for Liturgy and Music at Virginia Seminary is a growing experience for me. I hope it will be for us all as well as we discover new ways to enrich our worship experience. I am grateful for your openness to exploring some of these new ways. In our approach to financial stewardship, I am hopeful that this congregation can find purpose in looking at our giving in some new and creative ways, ways that not only will enrich our mission and ministry as a parish but that will enrich our own lives as we experience the joy of sacramental giving in response to God’s love for us.

At the center of our life together in Christ here at Epiphany is our reliance upon the guidance of the Holy Spirit. May we find God’s presence and may we find hope in the transitions we each experience in our lives, and may we always be open to the leading of God’s spirit in our midst.

“Stewardship”

The Stewardship Committee met on August 5th and 19th. We went to two meetings for August and September as we work on finalizing our plans for the 2016 ingathering.

While we still have some details to work out plans are coming together nicely. Your stewardship committee has decided to reduce the time between the pledge cards being received and being returned. We are going from six weeks down to two this year. We will also be doing things a little differently by having the pledge cards blessed before they go out. Cards will be blessed and available to pick up on October 25th. Any not picked up after the service will be mailed on Monday. This will help reduce the cost of mailing the cards out.

After attending the diocese stewardship planning seminar it was determined that there should be a devotional to be used for the eight weeks of stewardship leading up to the ingathering. With the newsletter this month you will find an article written by The Rt. Rev. Dan Edwards, bishop of Nevada for The Episcopal Network for Stewardship devotional which is found on page 11. Our hope is to develop our own version in 2016 to be used for the 2017 stewardship program. We have also chosen a stewardship program for use with our Sunday school and youth to help increase their understanding of stewardship. The book will be provided to the Christian Ed committee as soon as we receive it.

Great things are planned and we hope you will read, digest and enjoy all the information we provide you over the next few months as you prayerfully consider your pledge for 2016.

Where are your treasures?

1 Corinthians 9:9: As it is written, “He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever”.

Paul is quoting Psalm 112:9 here as he was explaining giving to the church of Corinth. Here is the psalm in its entirety: ¹ Praise the LORD. Blessed are those who fear the LORD, who find great delight in his commands. ² Their children will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed. ³ Wealth and riches are in their houses, and their righteousness endures forever. ⁴ Even in darkness light dawns for the upright, for those who are gracious and compassionate and righteous. ⁵ Good will come to those who are generous and lend freely, who conduct their affairs with justice. ⁶ Surely the righteous will never be shaken; they will be remembered forever. ⁷ They will have no fear of bad news; their hearts are steadfast, trusting in the LORD. ⁸ Their hearts are secure, they will have no fear; in the end they will look in triumph on their foes. ⁹ They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor, their righteousness endures forever; their horn will be lifted high in honor. ¹⁰ The wicked will see and be vexed, they will gnash their teeth and waste away; the longings of the wicked will come to nothing.

When our walk with God is right our giving is right! Everything in life is taken to a whole new level when we focus on God and walk in His ways. Many times we think that tithing our gifts means giving financially to the church and while it is important to financially support the church often God asks us to give of our time. Maybe you are one of the many that come in on a Saturday morning and fix lunches to be distributed through our outreach program, maybe you provide goodies at coffee hour or spend time talking to others that need comfort or counseling in and outside of our parish. Maybe you are like I was a few years ago feeling like you should be doing something but not yet dipping your toe in the pool. As we go through this season of stewardship, pray and ask how you might be used in the coming year. How we share all of our God given gifts is important in our relationship with our Heavenly Father. After all we are God’s hand and feet on earth.

As you begin to consider your financial gift for this year I want to end with this story I heard recently. A young man goes speeding down the road in his brand new Mercedes. As he careens around a curve he loses control and crashes into a tree. As help arrives the young man is heard crying out “Oh my beautiful car, my beautiful car, just look at my beautiful car”. One of the rescuers grabs the young man and says how can you be concerned about your car, you have lost your arm, to which the young man begins crying out “Oh my new Rolex, my Rolex”. This is a story used to prompt the listener to consider where they are storing up their treasures. Maybe we need to ask ourselves are we storing our treasures on earth or in heaven?

The Giver

Stewardship Narrative Series presented by TENS

Abraham cast Hagar and her baby into the desert with nothing but some bread and water. When those ran out, Hagar left Ishmael alone because she could not bear to watch him die. When baby Ishmael lost everything—parents, sustenance, shelter—he had nothing—but the God that saved him.

Ishmael's polar opposite is Willy Loman in "The Death Of A Salesman." Thomas Dumm describes Willy as lonely, alienated, and trapped in the struggle to succeed by having. But the life of having is empty.

"Getting and spending we lay waste our powers. Little we see in nature that is ours." (Wordsworth)

Psychoanalyst Eric Fromm said that Western culture had promised us happiness through possessions, but that a life of getting, spending, and clutching had failed to deliver. It cuts us off from ourselves and reduces us to jumping through economic hoops. But we can live happily through participation in the dance of humanity.

Fromm calls that "being." We develop the capacity for being through letting go of possessions and connecting with each other.

Gabriel Marcel says the problem is treating the world as something we can watch, dominate, possess, manipulate. He calls that "having." We can "have" our families as much as our homes. We stand one step

removed from everything; using instead

of celebrating.

Real life happens when we give ourselves away. It's as vulnerable as baby Ishmael because it is engaged with others, participating rather than controlling. It's surfing.

Jesus' disciples left everything to follow him. Eventually, they asked, "Now what will we get in return?" Jesus said, "Whoever finds his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it." The word translated as "life" is psyche. It means our core identity.

Communion is about plunging into a spontaneous flowing state of appreciation and gratitude. We place our gifts on God's altar to represent all we have and all we are. Our gifts are blessed, broken, and shared with one another. It is the exchange of having for being. We give ourselves to God and open our hearts to life.

Meister Eckhart said, "The person who is full of things is empty of God; but the person who is empty of things is full of God." He also said, "No one ever gave so much of himself away that he did not have more to give."
