

**WHO WE ARE:**

The Church of the Epiphany is one of 181 parishes of the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia, which is one of 110 dioceses in The Episcopal Church (USA), one of 44 member churches in the worldwide Anglican Communion.

FROM FATHER ANDREW...

The past month brought two traumatic events to our country. The first occurred down the road from us in Charlottesville. Well organized and well-armed Neo-Nazis, Ku Klux Klan members, and White-Nationalist descended on that city. They chanted "Jews will not replace us" and "Blood and Soil." Several people were injured, two state troopers: Lt. H. Jay Cullen and Trooper Berke M. M. Bates died in a helicopter crash, and Heather Heyer was murdered by a terrorist attack committed with a car.

The second was the devastating flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey in Texas and Louisiana. The flooding was historic. The total damage is projected to be unprecedented; costlier than both Katrina and Sandy combined.

These two events seemed unreal. How could such naked hate be alive and growing in our community? How could the fourth largest city in the United States be turned into a lake? It all seemed impossible.

What did not seem impossible was the response to these events. In the face of evil, clergy from this diocese, other denominations, and people from across the country gathered to protest in opposition peacefully. They prayed for their enemies and gave a witness to the love and mercy of God that far surpasses any human understanding. In the face of catastrophic devastation, people risked their own lives to save those of strangers. Aid poured in from people who had never been to Houston, and who will most likely never meet the people it will help.

We have seen some of the worse parts of our nation and some of its greatest dangers. In direct response, we have also seen some of the best qualities and attributes of the people of this land.

The evil seen in Charlottesville was not born overnight and will not disappear anytime soon. The recovery of the Gulf States will take years to come anywhere near whole again. I have faith in both of these challenges being defeated and overcome. I have faith in the good will of the vast majority of the people of this land. Most of all I have faith in God. There is no power; not hate or bigotry or violence, more powerful than God's eternal love. There is no force stronger; not wind or rain or flood, stronger than God's love for his children.

We will overcome. We will heal. We will rebuild. We will, with God's help, be the people of compassion, charity, and peace I know and believe we are.

## **Stewardship**

This year the Diocese had chosen "All Hearts Open" as the stewardship theme. This comes from the collect at the beginning of the Holy Eucharist Rite 1 and is the collect for purity:

*Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid; Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.*

The Collect for Purity was likely based on Psalm 51 and dates back to the 11<sup>th</sup> century missals (books containing the texts used in the Roman Catholic Mass). But if you are like me you are probably wondering what a collect actually is. This is from the Diocese website:

What is a Collect? A Collect is a prayer that addresses one petition (in this prayer it is purity) and is its own literary form, usually consisting of five parts: I. the address, II. the acknowledgment, III. the petition, IV. the aspiration, and V. the pleading.

As you prayerfully consider your pledge to the work of Epiphany for 2018 keep the words of the Collect for Purity in your heart and mind.

The way the schedule works is We start at dinner and carry over until breakfast/lunch the next day. For example: Tuesday would be dinner on 10/10 and breakfast and lunch would be for 10/11. Emmanuel will provide dinner starting on Wednesday October 11 and continue until the end.

As reported previously this will be the last CARITAS event as they will move into a new all encompassed facility in 2018.

It takes a huge effort from everyone at this church and we have always met this challenge. 32 Women are scheduled to attend this year along with a counselor.

**It takes a lot to make this happen. For example:**

Boiled Eggs: 12 dozen

Water: 8 cases of bottled water

Milk: 4 gallons

Butter: 6 pounds

Toilet paper: 60 rolls

Paper towels: 30 rolls

Laundry detergent: At least 6 large bottles

Toiletry products( soap, tooth brush, mouth wash etc) for 32 women

Quarters: The laundry machines "eats" quarters. We need 32 rolls

The list goes on and on.....

**We need people of all talents to help:**

Servers

Clean-up

Monitors

People to stay all night, to represent the church for the four nights in the event there are issues.

Transporters: For showers and laundry

Most importantly we need YOU to become involved in your Parrish. No effort is too small

We challenge each ministry with-in this church to sign up for a full day. It doesn't matter if members from a particular ministry teams up with individuals or other groups. Or you can form your own group. The 32 ladies coming here need you!

**Nov. 26<sup>th</sup>:** If we decide to do mixes in jars as our fundraiser this will be the night we do it. Please come prepared to work hard. Pizza included. Sign up in advance, no cost.

**Dec. 3, 10, and 17<sup>th</sup>:** We sell mixes. Need a minimum of two youth a week to work the table.
