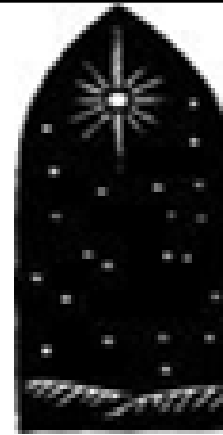

From Mary's Desk:

Diocesan Council is one of those events that are a trial to us introverts – lots of wonderful things going on, but too much all at once! But in the midst of the busy-ness and the noise, there are moments of pure joy. Getting the chance to have a quiet conversation with a friend, seeing some of the amazing things our young people around the diocese are doing, prayer and worship services, singing in the diocesan choir.

It is often hard to peel away the stress of all the hundred things at come at us each day and see these little gems of beauty and peace underneath. We've been talking about this in our Monday book group – opening your eyes to be aware of the myriad little surprising joys that God leaves scattered like leaves on the ground, waiting for us to notice them. This week, mine was the startlingly red head of a woodpecker at our feeder, so bright on a gray damp day.

Think of the joys in your life: the moment you realize your head cold has gone away, the evening when your child does his homework without prodding, the smile on the face of the toddler in the cart ahead of yours on the grocery store checkout line, a hot cup of tea and a good book.

Our lives are a necklace constructed of the shimmering pearls of these moments, interspersed with the onyx beads of our challenges and trials. We may think the necklace is nothing but dark beads, but if we open our eyes and our hearts we might see the pearls around us.
