What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have killed them by the words of my mouth, and my judgment goes forth as the light. Reader A Reading from Romans [4:13-25]

The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations") —in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall

your descendants be." He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader of the synagogue came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died; but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, for she said to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And instantly the woman was made well. When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, he said, "Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. And the report of this spread throughout that district.

The altar table is open. All baptized Christians, regardless of their denomination, are invited to receive communion at Epiphany. If you would like to be Baptized, thereby entering into membership in the mystical Body of Christ, the Church, please contact the Priest-in-Charge.

For Those Who Wish a Blessing

All are welcome to come to the altar and receive a blessing from the priest. If you would like a blessing, please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest.

How to Receive Communion

To receive the bread, lay your right hand in your left hand, palm open. To receive the wine, as the priest brings the chalice to your mouth, gently touch the base of the chalice and help guide it to your lips. The proper response after receiving is to say, "Amen."

We do not allow the practice of intinction, or dipping the bread into the consecrated wine. If you do not wish to receive the consecrated wine, please cross your arms over your chest as the chalice bearer approaches. Although we encourage reception in both kinds, the grace of God present in the holy sacrament is fully available in the bread or the wine alone.

If you would like communion brought to you in your pew, please tell an usher and the priest will come to you.

- Q. What is meant by a covenant with God?

Introducing the Lesson

1st Reading: Hosea 5:15-6:6

Our opening lesson is a dialogue between God and the people: the Lord desires a faithful love and knowledge of God rather than fleeting emotions and ritual offerings. Israel and Judah have strayed far from the Lord's service and have worshiped other gods. For this they have suffered. Now they presume that a brief repentance will restore them to God's favor.

2nd Reading: Romans 4:13-25

In this lesson Paul explains that the new relationship with God is open to everyone who follows in the way of Abraham's faith. This means that righteousness before God comes through God's free gift and the response of faith—not because of obedience to the law. This was first true in the case of Abraham, who trusted in God's promise before the law even existed. This faith was "reckoned to him as righteousness". Now it is true for all who have faith and so show themselves to be among Abraham's descendants from many nations. among Abraham's descendants from many nations.

The Gospel: Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

In the gospel story Jesus calls Matthew the tax collector to be his follower, heals a woman with hemorrhages, and raises a young girl from death. Tax collectors at this time were looked down upon as extortionists and collaborators with the occupying Roman enemy. Yet it is not those who are considered well who require Jesus' acceptance of them, but those who are in need of healing. Jesus remembers God's words spoken through the prophet Hosea, "I desire mercy, not sacrifice". Jesus is then shown acting in mercy through the healing of the woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages (which would have rendered her unclean), and in the raising of the daughter of the have rendered her unclean), and in the raising of the daughter of the synagogue official.
