Introducing the Lessons

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 30:9-14

This Hebrew Bible reading offers a promise of prosperity to the people who obey God's commandments. His counsel is presented as the teaching of Moses. It was probably written at a later time when the law was not well observed. Yet the Lord's word is not distant or hard to understand. God has not left the divine will in doubt. It is near to hand in the commandments God has given.

2nd Reading: Colossians 1:1-14

In this lesson Paul greets the Christians at Colossae, offers thanks for their faith, and prays for their further strengthening. Paul had apparently not visited this city in the country today known as Turkey, but he praises his fellow servant Epaphras, who brought the gospel to the new converts. The apostle asks that they may be filled with spiritual understanding and be fruitful in good works. So will they give thanks to the God who has rescued them from the power of darkness and evil and brought them into the kingdom of the Son of God.

The Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

The gospel is the lawyer's question and the parable of the Good Samaritan. While testing Jesus, this expert in the law asks a question at the heart of human longing: how can life's true meaning and purpose be realized? Jesus causes him to answer for himself with the summary of the law. Recognizing how hard it is to put such lofty commandments into practice, the lawyer next asks, who is the neighbor that I am to love? Jesus hears his real question (who is not my neighbor?) and tells him the story of a man who could help another without requiring the law's definition.

Outreach Opportunities

On June 18th, the diaper ministry held the most recent diaper distribution. There were 54 families in attendance, and 12 of those families were new. The diaper ministry continues to hold diaper distribution on the third Saturday of each month from 10 am to 12:00 noon. Through this inspiring ministry, we continue to share God's love and develop relationships within our community. Our next diaper distribution day is on July 16th. A sign-up sheet is on the outreach board in the parish hallway for anyone interested in volunteering. If anyone would like to donate diapers, sizes 4 through 6 continue to be the greatest need. Other Outreach within our Community: I was asked and have been participating in the Holladay School Community Impact Committee as a representative for the Church of the Epiphany. This group has asked churches in the community, and stakeholders, within the community surrounding Lakeside and Holladay Elementary School, to support them in reaching their families and students within their school. We have supported them in the past, and continue to do so, however, since the pandemic attendance has been one of the issues they have struggled with, getting students registered for school has also been an issue. I have offered for a school representative to join us during diaper ministry, as many families who attend diaper ministry are in the school district, to show our support, involvement, and building bridges within our community. Everyone who has visited us during our diaper distribution, whether they speak the same language or not, has had any involvement with our parish through Holladay Elementary School, all know that **"Love Lives Here,"** something that I am very proud to say with certainty of our parish!
